A letter from our EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear Friends of Cancer Support Community South Bay,

2023 was a year marked by new beginnings and significant milestones. It is with great enthusiasm that I address you as the newly appointed Executive Director/CEO of this amazing organization. I am truly excited for the opportunity to lead CSC South Bay toward its continued growth and impact in our community. I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude for your many years of generous support and dedication to our mission. You have been the driving force behind our achievements. I feel honored to join such a passionate and committed community.

In the past year, we have seen more need than ever for our valuable free support programs. We witnessed a nearly 46% rise in first-time attendees compared to 2022, a sobering reflection of the pandemic's impact on cancer screenings and healthcare access. Additionally, we saw a significant increase in younger people with children diagnosed with advanced stages of cancer contributing to a 124% increase in visits to our Kids Community programs. It is only through your compassionate support that we have continued making a meaningful difference in the lives of these families facing the challenges of this devastating disease.

Responding to the evolving needs of our participants, we opted to maintain a blend of virtual and in-person/hybrid formats for our 200 free programs offered each month. This reflects our commitment to serving our participants in the way that ensures the best accessibility and inclusivity for all those in our community that are affected by cancer.

Our 26th Annual Celebrate Wellness event reached new heights thanks to your generosity, raising a record-breaking \$428,000. The event honored long-time supporters Kyle and Diane Kazan and welcomed a sold-out crowd of 600 guests. We also recognized CSC South Bay group facilitators, Steve Lottenberg, MD, PsyD and Ruth Schriebman PsyD, LMFT for their incredible 25-years of service as highlighted in this report. It was a beautiful evening bringing the community together for support and celebration. We also extend our profound gratitude to our community partners whose beneficiary events throughout the year raised an additional \$160,000 for CSC South Bay.

We are especially proud to share that CSC South Bay received special recognition from the community in 2023, being chosen Best Nonprofit and Favorite Counseling Company in the Daily Breeze and Beach Reporter's 32nd Annual South Bay's Best Readers' Choice Awards. This honor is a testament to the hard work and dedication of our team as well as the invaluable support of the community.

Celebrating 25 YEARS of SERVICE

A very special milestone was reached in 2023 by Dr. Steve Lottenberg and Dr. Ruth Schriebman—fondly known to their CSC South Bay family as "Steve and "Ruth". The past year marked their 25th year of leading support groups at CSC South Bay. Their longstanding commitment has been a lifeline and continual source of strength to our participants. Both were recognized with 25-year service awards and commendations by Los Angeles County at CSC South Bay's 26th Annual Celebrate Wellness event.

Steve's journey at CSC South Bay began after his wife was diagnosed with cancer, inspiring him to want to help others who were going through cancer get the best possible healthcare. He shared that his years leading bereavement groups have been enormously gratifying in that he has been able to observe and experience the growth of many family members from hopelessness to learning to live a fulfilling life.

During his time at CSC South Bay, he also gained a deeper understanding of the toll that cancer takes on a family when his own daughter was diagnosed with cancer at just 15 years of age. Tragedy struck again in 2021 when he lost his wife to a recurrence of the disease.

"I have learned so much over the previous 20 plus years getting to work with so many courageous participants. This was certainly significant in helping me grieve. I feel very rewarded by receiving from them how to live life during the most challenging experiences they were ever faced with. It is this sense of community combined with education, understanding and hope that is what we here at CSC South Bay are all about." Ruth's dedication to CSC South Bay began as an intern seeking professional licensure. Inspired by her experience, she chose to stay and continue facilitating support groups after completing her internship. She shared that the most rewarding aspects of her work were seeing participants connect and find a safe place to be with others who understand what they are going through.

She was also personally affected by the disease when her husband was diagnosed with cancer just a year after she started. In 2022, she experienced her own health struggle when she was diagnosed with a benign brain tumor.

"After all the years working with cancer patients there are many things I've learned. A sense of normalcy or a new normalcy can be regained and there is hope and a life can be reclaimed. There is a camaraderie with others "Who get it." You can gain knowledge about your diagnosis. Friendships are formed. We have great programs, workshops that are educational as well as workshops that are mind body focused. We are proud to say that all of our services are free of charge."

Together, Steve and Ruth have witnessed tremendous growth during their long tenure at CSC South Bay, including a new name, location, the amount and variety of programs offered, and significantly, the introduction of virtual programming which has extended the organization's reach beyond the South Bay.

We congratulate them both for their incredible 25 years of service and dedication. Their invaluable guidance has positively impacted the lives of thousands of cancer patients in our community, for which we are immensely grateful.
